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Welcome



The Leighton Linslade School Sports Partnership has worked over a number of years to develop a series of SCHOOL GAMES EVENTS for ALL Schools and Young People within the area

CORE SCHOOL GAMES EVENTS

Under the nationally funded School Games programme contract funding provides a School Games Organiser role for a maximum of 3 days a week With the expectation it is expected that an SGO will facilitate a minimum of 12 targeted inter school competitions/events/festivals with clear intents. All the Core School Games Events are Free for all schools

WIDER SCHOOL GAMES EVENTS

As outlined by Sports England, charges may be levied at schools where unavoidable costs are incurred in delivering an event (e.g. cover the cost of facilities, additional staff etc.) or additional "Wider" School Games events organised for Schools

This Handbook covers both CORE and WIDER School Games events -

* will indicate CORE School Games events in the tables.

The Leighton Linslade School Games Events aim to:-

- Inspire children and young people to have confidence, competence and knowledge to reach their potential and to live healthy and physically active life's
- Promote health and well being in individual young people, whole classes and the whole wider community
- Provide MEANINGFUL and appropriate levels of events / competitions to allow ALL young people to take part and feel a sense of achievement.
- Encourage personal challenges to allow every young person to improve their own performance







INTRA

Sporting activity taking place between pupils that attend the same school

INTER

Local Inter School sporting activity taking place between schools from the same area. Events will be designed at 4 levels, so appropriate to participants

- LEARN
- DEVELOP

COUNTY

A County showcase event held either as culmination of a series of local inter school events or as an open entry events, with invitations made by the Active Partnership

Alongside providing fun competitions for young people, the Leighton Linslade School Sports Partnership also supports schools to deliver 30 active minutes within the school day and ideas for 30 active minutes outside of the school day

Types of SCHOOL GAMES EVENTS



PLAY -

These events are non-competitive, with participation and fun being the focus, targeting young people who may have lack of confidence but want to to participate



LEARN -

These events are for young people have primarily not taken part in the school games and the intent is to learn new skills and activities



DEVELOP -

These events are the first stages of competition, but winning is not the sole focus. Results will not be recorded during these events - School Games Value Awards will be presented



COMPETE -

These events will target young people who are competitive, Participation may see the event winners progress to County Finals and beyond if pathways exist in the sport, gender and age group.

CODE OF CONDUCT

Participants I will :

- Enjoy the experience and have fun.
- Be proud to achieve my personal best.
- Act fairly and honestly at all times.
- Praise and encourage others.
- Say Well Done to the opposition and thank my teacher/coach/official.
- Adopt the School Games Values

Young Leaders & Volunteers

I will :

- Act as a role model to participants and other young people, taking pride in my appearance and behaviour.
- Be confident in all my decisions.
- Always consider health, safety and welfare of the players.
- Be polite, acting responsibly and appropriately at all times
- Make sure all players show respect to team mates, opposition, spectators and myself.
- Adopt the School Games Values

Adults - Teachers, Parents, Coaches, Event leads.

I will :

- Ensure young people have an enjoyable, fun experience
- Encourage fair play and respect all teams and participants with positive communications including communication via online platforms
- Encourage your players to treat all participants, teachers, coaches and officials with respect.
- Be polite, acting responsibly and appropriately at all times.
- Always consider Health, safety and well being of all young people and other adults
- Respect the decisions of Young Officials and event organisers
- Adopt the School Games Values

RESPONSIBILITIES

The Leighton Linslade School Games is a school event and it is expected that all teams will be school teams, as with all school trips you are required to complete your own regular off-site forms for your school. including Your own Risk Assessments.

We expect all teams to abide by their own school policies on use of adult helpers and support team travelling to the event and providing support on the day

The school is ultimately responsible for the safeguarding of their own pupils at the event/competition

Schools should bring the OWN FIRST AID KITS and FIRST AIDERS to all events

Please ensure your team members have appropriate school policies in place for parents and carers consent etc. in place prior to the events

PHOTOGRAPHIC / VIDEO CONSENT

All pupils WITHOUT photographic / Video consent will need to be made aware to the event organiser and may be required to wear a wristband for the event.

Teachers/Staff are asked to help ensure these pupils are not photographed.

Only school staff are allowed to take photographs of THEIR own pupils and inhouse LLSSP publicity shots will be checked with schools prior to publication

Parents should be made aware their child may feature in long/wide framed pictures but we will endeavour to ensure they wont be identifiable.

PRINCIPLES OF COMPETITION

As part of our commitment to improving the competitive experiences for all young people we will be using "Principles of Competition & SMILES" We hop that all schools in our Partnership adopt and are committed to these.

Principles of Competition

- 1. The young person's motivation, competence and confidence are the centre of the competition
- 2. The focus is on the PROCESS rather than the OUTCOME (On Learning and values and development of the young person rather than the result of matches/games etc.
- 3. Volunteers, leaders and officials are appropriately trained and display behaviour's reflective of the nature of the competition.
- 4. The environment is safe and creates opportunities to learn and maximise social development
- 5. The facility and environment that is created for the competition reflects the motivation, competence and confidence of the young people and format of the competition

SMILES

If all the competitions are followed that should result in SMILES: Use the below check list:

SAFE - Participants feel physically and emotionally safe.

MAXIMUM PARTICIPATION - participants are fully involved all of the time.

INCLUSIVE - All participants can take part : activities designed to suit and develop all abilities.

LEARNING - Participants develop personal, social, creative, thinking and physical skills.

ENJOYMENT - Activities recognise individual and personnel needs.

SUCCESS - Participants feel they are making progress and achievement.

N.B - While its not a letter in SMILES "FAIR PLAY" is paramount to all that happens in events

FAIRNESS underpins inclusion, enjoyment and success
